PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that any qualified elector of Bay County who is not already registered, may register to vote at the office the of City Clerk, the office of the Township Clerk, the office of the County Clerk, a Secretary of State branch office, or other designated state agency. Reg-

istration forms can be obtained at mi.gov/vote and mailed to the local Clerk. Voters who are already registered may update their registration at www.expressSOS.com.

The last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk is Monday October 24, 2022.

After this date, anyone who qualifies as an elector may

register to vote in person with proof of residency with their local clerk (MCL 168.497).

Electors who wish to register to vote or change their registration address, are advised to contact their County, City, or Township Clerk for office hours and other information.

State Proposal 22-1: A proposal to amend the state constitution to require annual public financial disclosure reports by legislators and other state officers and change state legislator term limit to 12 total years in legislature.

State Proposal 22-2: A proposal to amend the state constitution to add provisions regarding elections.

State Proposal 22-3: A proposal to amend the state constitution to establish new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make all decisions about pregnancy and abortion; allow state to regulate abortion in some cases; and forbid prosecution of individuals exercising establish right.

County 911 Central Dispatch Millage Proposal: The limitation on the amount of general ad valorem taxes in Bay County be increased by no more than 1.05 mills for a period of 6 years, 2022 through 2027, for the continued operation of and capital improvements to Bay County 9-1-1 Central Dispatch.

County Animal Services and Adoption Center (Formerly Known as “Animal Control”) Millage Proposal: The amount of general ad valorem taxes in Bay County be increased by no more than .7 of a mill for a period of 6 years, 2022 through 2027 for the continued operation of and capital improvements to the Bay County Animal Services and Adoption Center (formerly known as “Animal Control”) including construction of an addition or new building.

County Gypsy Moth Suppression Program Millage Renewal: The amount of general ad valorem taxes in Bay County be increased by no more than .0996 of a mill for a period of 6 years, 2022 through 2027, inclusive, to be used for the suppression and monitoring of and public education surrounding, Gypsy Moths and other invasive, non-native pests that damage local horticulture (trees and plants).

County Services to Older Citizens Millage Proposal: The amount of general ad valorem taxes in Bay County be increased by no more than .85 of a mill for a period of 6 years, 2022 through 2027, inclusive, to be used for the provision of services to older citizens (60 years and older) in Bay County provided by the Bay County Department on Aging and needed capital improvements to Department on Aging facilities.

County Bay Medical Care Facility Millage Renewal:

The limitation on the amount of general ad valorem taxes in Bay County be increased by not more than .7476 of a mill for a period of 6 years, 2023 through 2028, inclusive, for the operation, maintenance, and capital costs of the Bay Medical Care Facility.

School District of the City of Bay City Operating Millage Proposal: The school district will continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other properly exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

City of Essexville Proposal: Shall the 2022 City Charter proposed by the Essexville Charter Commission be adopted?

City of Pinconning Proposal: The amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the City of Pinconning, be increased by 3 mills for a period of three (3) years beginning in the year 2023 and ending 2025, inclusive for the purpose of providing funds to the Department of Public Safety for operating costs and expenses for sworn police officers and for related program support for the Department of Public Safety.

Garfield Township Fire Truck Millage Proposal: The tax limitation on all taxable property within the Township of Garfield, be increased in an amount not to exceed 1.5 mills for ten (10) years, 2022 to 2031 inclusive, to provide funds for the purpose of purchasing, maintaining, and equipping a new fire truck.

Garfield Township Operating Millage Proposal: The tax limitation on all taxable property within the Township of Garfield, be increased in an amount not to exceed 1.4385 mills, of which 1.4038 mill is a renewal of the millage rate that expires in 2022 and .0347 mill is new additional millage, for four (4) years, 2023 to 2026 inclusive, to provide funds for operation, maintaining, and purchasing for the fire department or any other purpose authorized by law for the fire service purposes.

Garfield Township Equipment Millage Proposal: The tax limitation on all taxable property within the Township of Garfield, be increased in an amount not to exceed .719 mill of which .7017 mill is a renewal of the millage rate that expires in 2022 and .0174 mill is new additional millage, for four (4) years, 2023 to 2026 inclusive, to provide funds for purchasing firefighting equipment for the fire

department.

Gibson Township Recreational Marijuana Proposal: Shall Gibson Township, Bay County, Michigan, opt out of recreational commercial adult use marijuana?

Kawkawlin Township Marijuana Facilities Proposal: Shall the township of Kawkawlin adopt a proposal to provide for recreational marijuana establishment permits to operate in the township for at least 5 growers, 5 processors, 5 retailers, and 1 secure transporter, and to allow the current medical marijuana permit holders in the township to add equivalent adult use permits on request and payment of a \$5,000 fee?

Essexville-Hampton Schools Proposal: The school district continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, required for the school district to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Saginaw ISD Proposal: The 1.9389 mills limitation on the annual property tax previously approved for the education of students with a disability be increased by 1.5611 mills for a period of 10 years, 2022 to 2031.

Bangor-Monitor Metro Water District Proposal A: The Bangor-Monitor Metropolitan District Charter be amended so that it permits the fiscal year to correspond with the calendar year, and in order to accomplish this, it allows for a one-time only fiscal year from August 1st, 2022, through December 31st, 2023, and the fiscal year will thereafter correspond with the calendar year, January 1st through December 31st.

Bangor-Monitor Metro Water District Proposal B: The Bangor-Monitor Metropolitan District Charter be amended to permit each member of the district commission, to receive as compensation for his or her official services, the sum of the Two thousand (\$2,000) Dollars per year, payable bi-annually (June and December) in equal installments, together with Seventy-five (\$75.00) Dollars for each special meeting actually attended by him or her, to become effective only as to those Commissioners elected hereafter.

Bangor-Monitor Metro Water District Proposal C: Cost of living increase for district commission members, Compensation for district commission members shall be adjusted by December 31st for every even year by the Consumer Price Index, published by the United States Department of Labor.
